

Some places to hide to avoid giving a speech

Under the stairs is the classic hiding place, but it's also the first place they'll look for you.

You could try just not showing up for the day, but then everyone will know why!

Best place to hide is in the crowd, get your friends to mill about and help you blend in and act ignorant of your whereabouts.

OR

You could give the speech and be pretty damn good. You need some confidence, which you can gain from experience, and some experience, which you can gain with confidence.

Lets create some occasions with a safe and friendly audience to practice public speaking, and we will coach you through developing your skill and personal style.



Most of the time it's not what you say, it's how you say it...

...Fortunately we are also experts at body language and stage craft.

Some free ideas that can improve students ability at public speaking.

- During an occasional meeting, ask students to stand as they speak. This helps get people comfortable with the idea of public presentations in a safe environment.
- 2. In advance of any speech, take the student to the venue and give them some time on the stage, practice the speech there, project their voice to the back of the venue, practice with a microphone.
- 3. Call for volunteers to give a short speech on a topic of their choice. At the end ask the audience to give helpful comments on what the speaker did well, and then what the speaker could improve on.
- 4. Consider purchasing a resource kit from Second Strike on public speaking for handouts, tip sheets and more ideas.
